

## Christ Church Anglican Longford

WW1 Honour Roll dedicated to the fallen. It is made of Blackwood and is of unique design. It is beautiful with extensive carving and fretwork decorations at the top. In the top section of each of the three name panels is more ornate carved work. Above the list of names of the fallen is a bas relief carving of an angelic mother and child. It is believed that the carving was done by a Miss Field of "Westfield".

At the end of the Honour Roll are the names of four men listed as being "In Camp". These are marked with asterisks.

Under the list of the fallen is carved in relief:

The Mothers Gave Their Sons  
Their Sons Gave Their Lives

At the bottom of the memorial is carved in relief:

This Roll of Honour Is Erected By The Mothers Union In Gratitude To The Men  
Of This Parish Who Served In The Great War And In Proud But Sorrowful  
Thanksgiving For Those Who Died For Their Country
